PORT JERVIS SUMMER ELIGIBILITY POLICY

- 1. A High School Student that registers for a full credit course in summer school must comply with the following:
 - A) Was enrolled and completed the course during the school year.
 - B) Has taken the final exam.
 - C) Has received a failing grade between 50-64.
- Students who dropped a full credit course during the school year are NOT eligible to take that course in summer school.
- High School Students who received a grade below 50 are NOT eligible to take the course in summer school.
- High School Students that did NOT meet their lab requirements in a science course are NOT eligible to take the course in summer school.
- 5. Students with class periods 1&3 will be assigned a study hall for Period 2 as well as students needing extra help or study time.

Half-credit courses available to students that may or may not require a prerequisite are:

- Economics
- Health
- Participation in Government
